# MANAGEMENT NEWS

#### **Management News**

Happy Summer everyone!!! It's that time of year again when we get excited to go back outside and enjoy the weather and our surroundings. It's also the time of year when the children like to enjoy playing in the water whenever they have the chance to. Thankfully, Hanover Grove has its own splash pad, The Grove Cove where people of any age can enjoy some aquatic fun during these hot days.

I would like to start by sharing that The Grove Cove has been scheduled to be open for a total of 25 days so far this season and has only been closed for two of those days due to weather. It is our goal to maintain the posted hours of operation for the duration of the season as weather conditions will allow. If you haven't already signed up and received your key fob for access, I would encourage you to do so by contacting the Business Office during regular business hours. If you have misplaced your key fob, we can issue a replacement key fob at a cost of \$25.00 that will be added to your account.

Please understand that you are responsible for the behavior of all of your guests and privileges and access can be revoked if you and/or your guests are not following the posted Rules.

It should also be noted that our number one expense here at Hanover Grove is the water and sewer charges that we receive from the City every month. Accordingly, we have several rules and regulations regarding water usage that I would like to reference...

#### SECTION 111(b) - WATER CONSERVATION MEASURES

Swimming pools are not permitted on Cooperative property.

111.7 Car washes are prohibited.

111.8 Use of the outdoor hose spigots to wash the buildings or clean the outside of the property is prohibited, with the exception of the Cooperative's scheduled pressure washing.

111.9 Showerheads are limited to a maximum of 1.5 gallons per minute.

111.10 Watering of Cooperative lawns shall be limited to 15 minutes per day, with the days being limited by City of Fraser watering restrictions.

# MANAGEMENT NEWS

Please understand that we have put these rules and regulations in place in an effort to keep everyone's carrying charges to a minimum. With water and sewer being our number one expense, it is imperative that everyone follow these rules without exception. Any member found in violation of the above listed rules will be subject to an Administrative Enforcement Fee being added to their account.

I would also like to remind the members of the community of some of the other rules that should be followed at all times...

- Ball playing of **ANY KIND** or similar activity is prohibited within the Cooperative's property. This includes, but is not limited to: BASEBALL, SOFTBALL, SOCCER, FRISBEE, FOOTBALL, AND TENNIS, the tossing of any of the objects used in such activities between two or more people, or throwing such objects against walls, steps, etc. A "NERF" ball may be used, and badminton will be allowed provided the net is removed after each use. The resident will be responsible for repair or replacement of turf damaged as a result of this activity. Residents are invited to use the facilities in the public park located adjacent to the Cooperative.
- Members are responsible for maintenance of their front, side, back and surrounding yards and parking areas as far as keeping them free of litter, weeds, etc. You are asked to pick up debris as necessary and to sweep your parking area in the summer as often as necessary. The Cooperative will clean those areas not directly in front of units.
- No trash will be permitted outside the units except on garbage pickup days. As of the date of issuance of these Rules, garbage is picked up on Mondays and Fridays. Trash may only be placed in designated areas commencing at 6:00 P.M. the night before pickup. Because pickup times vary, residents must put trash out the night before pickup, and not on the morning of pickup.
- Patio areas may contain patio-type furniture or flower boxes or pots, and any other items permitted pursuant to these Rules and Regulations; but no other items may be stored or hung in such areas.
- Members shall not permit parking areas, landscaped areas and recreational areas to be cluttered with bicycles, carriages, sleds, toys, barbecue grills, waste receptacles or any other similar type objects.
- 108.5 Fireworks, in any form, in use or not, are <u>forbidden</u> within the Cooperative.

With the season changing and the weather warming up, it is vital that everyone follow the Rules and Regulations. Following the Rules and Regulations helps to protect everyone's investment here and also helps with keeping the community a desirable place to live. We certainly appreciate everyone's cooperation and look forward to a summer that we can all enjoy!

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees and line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 2. Combine the cake mix, flour, vegetable oil and egg whites. Mix well.
- 3. Add in the patriotic sprinkles, mixing well.
- 4. Scoop a tablespoon at a time of the cookie dough and roll into a ball using your hands. Place
- 2-3" a part on a cookie sheet.
- 5. Bake 8-10 minutes or until golden brown. Do not over-bake.


