

2022 PROPERTY TAX DEDUCTION WORK SHEET

For the Calendar ending December 31st, **2022** real estate taxes paid at Hanover Grove Cooperative was paid from **9.51%** of the Carrying Charges collected by the Cooperative from all members. Therefore, each member who lived during the entire year of **2022** is eligible to claim **9.51%** of their total carrying charges paid as a deduction on their income taxes and/or as a credit for Homestead Property Taxes paid on your behalf. The following formula is to be used to determine the amount of deduction if you lived in the Cooperative for part of the year or did not pay all of your carrying charges assessed in **2022**.

*Carrying charges paid in **2022** are defined by the IRS as <u>only</u> carrying charges payments that you directly made. Do not include membership fees, late charges, and repair charges paid. Payment made by outside parties on your behalf (HUD or MSHDA) are also not allowed. Use only the portion you paid directly for carrying charges each month in this calculation.

Members who have <u>not</u> missed any payment for **2022**, or were not receiving subsidy, may use the chart below to calculate your applicable tax deduction.

SECTION 107 - VEHICLES, PARKING & DRIVING REGULATIONS

During the winter months, residents must move their vehicles as necessary for snow removal by the Maintenance Department. The following schedule has been determined for snow removal from parking areas. The drivers of the trucks plowing the snow will honk their horns to notify you that they are attempting to plow your parking area.

YOUR COOPERATION IS REQUIRED.

- Members living in **even** addresses (i.e., 31008, 15608, etc.) will have their parking areas plowed between 9:00 am and 12:00 NOON. All cars must be removed from the parking areas before 9:00 a.m.
- 107.11(b) Members living in **odd** addresses (i.e. 31125, 15819, etc.) will have their parking areas plowed between 1:00 pm and 5:00 pm. All cars must be removed from the parking areas before 1:00 p.m.
- 107.11(c) The only exceptions to this rule will be those areas of Darby Lane and Van Avenue that have parking on one side of the street only and the Courts that comprise the 900 blocks of Darby, Sabre, and Van. These parking areas will be plowed in the afternoon, between 1:00 pm and 5:00 pm with the odd addresses.
- Residents not moving their cars during the appropriate time periods for snow removal may have their vehicles towed away at the owner's expense and receive a \$50.00 Administrative Enforcement Fee.
- Residents or their guests having inoperable vehicles in the parking areas during snow removal will also be subject to having their vehicles towed away at the owner's expense and receive a \$50.00 Administrative Enforcement fee.

ATTENTION RESIDENTS

- After your numbered parking spot/area is plowed and salted, please move your vehicle back to your numbered parking spot/area, thank you.
- If you do not have a Hanover Grove parking decal and you have not complied with the above rules, we will have no way to notify you and you will be towed away at your expense!



RECIPES

Bean Burritos



Prep: 5-10 Minutes

Cook: 20-25 Minutes

Total: 30 Minutes



Prep: 10 Minutes

Make Time: 9 Minutes

Total Time: 19 Minutes

Ingredients

- 1 can (16 ounces) refried beans
- 1 cup salsa
- 1 cup cooked long grain rice
- 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese, divided
- 12 tour flours tortillas

• Shredded lettuce (optional)

Directions

- Preheat oven to 375°. In a large bowl, combine beans, salsa, rice, and 1 cup cheese. Spoon about 1/3 cup mixture off-center on each tortilla. Fold the sides and ends over filling and roll up.
- Arrange burritos in a greased 13x9-inch. Baking dish. Sprinkle with remaining 1 cup cheese. Cover and bake until heated through, 20-25 minutes. If desired, top with lettuce. Enjoy!

Red Velvet Cookies

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup butter, slightly softened
- 3/4 cup brown sugar
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- 1 egg
- 1 and 1/2 cups all purpose flour
- 2 tablespoon cup cocoa powder
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 tablespoon milk
- 2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 tablespoon red/hot pink food coloring
- 1/2 cup sugar sprinkles (red or pink)
- 18 Dove promises, dark or milk chocolate

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 375F. Use a stand mixer fitted with the paddle attachment to beat the butter and the sugars together until creamed. Mix in the egg.
- 2. Separately mix together the flour, cocoa powder, baking soda, and salt. Add the dry mixture, the milk, the vanilla, and the red food coloring to the stand mixer and mix until dough forms.
- 3. Scoop 2 tablespoons of dough at a time and roll into a ball. Roll the ball in the granulated sugar to coat and place on an ungreased cookie sheet.
- 4. Bake cookies for 9 minutes. Remove from the oven and immediately press a Dove promise unto each cookie. Move the cookies to the refrigerator to keep the promises from melting.
