It's my favorite time of year again when the leaves begin to change and the evening air temps provide for "good sleeping weather." Happy Autumn Everyone!

I'm pleased to announce that the Hanover Grove Board of Directors has extended the timeframes for decorating for Halloween.

Decorations for Halloween may be put out beginning the 1st of October and can remain in place for the month of October. However, you must ensure that the Halloween decorations are removed no later than November 3rd.

I would also like to mention that the Board of Directors and Management here have decided to forego the Trunk-or-Treat that we have been hosting for the past couple of years. Alternatively, we are encouraging the resident population here to participate in Halloween in a more traditional way... we would love to see porch lights on between the hours of 5:00 and 7:00pm on Halloween night so that the children of our complex can Trick-or-Treat in their own community.

I also want to take a moment to let everyone know that we have changed the time that the monthly Open Board Meetings will be held. This month's Open Meeting is scheduled for 1:00pm on Thursday, October 19th at the Raymond Community Building on Sabre Lane. Our plan is to continue hosting Open Meetings at 1:00pm on the third Thursday of each month in the hopes that more residents can join us.

Lastly, it's that time of year when we go to cider mills and gather around bonfires to enjoy the crisp fall air. Please note that fires are permitted at Hanover Grove Cooperative as long as you adhere to Hanover Grove's Rules and Regulations and follow all of the City of Fraser Ordinances which state:

<u>Chapter 10 - Fire Prevention and Protection</u>

302.1 Recreational Fire. An outdoor fire burning only dry, seasoned firewood or commercially available charcoal briquettes on the ground in a prepared pit having a total fuel area of four (4) feet or less in diameter and two (2) feet or less in height for pleasure, warmth, or cooking food for human consumption. A permit is required for all recreational fires.

307.3 Location. The location for open burning shall not be less than 50 feet from any structure, other combustible appurtenances or material, public rights-of-way, and property lines, and provisions shall be made to prevent the fire from spreading within fifty (50) feet of any structure.

Exceptions: Fires in approved containers that are not less than 15 feet from a structure, other combustible material, public rights-of-way, and property lines. Additionally, all fire pits must have a cover in place during any and all burning of combustible materials.

That's all for this month. I hope that everyone has a safe and enjoyable Halloween!

An Open Letter Regarding Marijuana Usage at Hanover Grove

Dear Members:

If you are not aware, Hanover Grove Cooperative was constructed pursuant to a housing program initiated by Congress. As a result, the Cooperative entered into agreements which required it to be governed by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). This agreement required the Cooperative to adhere to regulations of the Federal Government as it relates to housing.

One of the primary directives from HUD is that the <u>Cooperative must remain drug free, which includes all illegal drugs, including marijuana.</u> When the Cooperative adopted its Rules and Regulations and Occupancy Agreement it included prohibitions against such drug use.

Therefore, by the Cooperative documents and Federal Law, members of Hanover Grove Cooperative are forbidden from the use of any illicit drug as defined by Federal Law. Further, the Rules and Regulations and your Occupancy Agreement requires that the Cooperative provide each member peaceful enjoyment of their townhome.

Each member must refrain from actions which deny other members peaceable enjoyment of their town-home. Loud noises such as blaring TV's or sound systems, late night parties, and vacuuming after 10:00 p.m. are examples of denying your right to peaceable enjoyment. Smoking marijuana is another example because of the strong smell which permeates through the walls and subjects your neighbors and their children to this nuisance denying them peaceable enjoyment.

Recently, the State of Michigan enacted a series of new laws which modify the use and enable restrictions on the use of marijuana. A section of that law, MCL 333.26427(c)(3) states that the owner (Cooperative) can prevent the smoking or cultivation of marijuana. Therefore, despite the fact that you may have a medical marijuana card authorizing the use, you are prohibited from smoking marijuana at the Cooperative for the two reasons set forth; 1) restriction imposed by HUD regarding illicit drugs as defined by Federal Law, and 2) the State law prohibiting its use in a multi-family environment.

Although the Cooperative cannot endorse the use of medical marijuana due to Federal law, for those who have the medical need for its use, there are many other products available that will not adversely affect your neighbors.

This letter should serve as notice that the Cooperative will aggressively enforce the restriction of the use of illicit drugs, including smoking marijuana in any form. Such use may result in the possible loss of your membership and eviction.



RECIPES

Mummy Jalapeno Poppers



Prep: 10 Minutes

Cook: 18 Minutes

Total: 28 Minutes



Prep: 10 Minutes

Make Time: 15 Minutes

Total Time: 25 Minutes

Ingredients

- 6 jalapenos
- 8 ounces cream cheese, softened
- 1/4 cup bacon baked until crispy and crumbled
- 12 black olives
- 1 refrigerated package crescent rolls

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 2. Remove stem, slice jalapenos in half lengthwise. Remove seeds.
- 3. In a small bowl, combine softened cream cheese and bacon pieces. Fill each jalapeno half with cream cheese mixture
- 4. Place two olives towards the top of the jalapenos to make the eyeballs.
- 5. Separate the crescent rolls into 4 parts. Press down on the perforation to make each one a solid sheet. Using a pizza cutter, slice each of the 4 sections into 9 thin strips.
- 6. Wrap each jalapeno with 3 strips of crescent roll, going from the top to bottom, then back down.
- 7. Place the wrapped jalapeno onto the baking sheet and bake for 18-20 minutes.
- 8. Enjoy!

Monster Cookies

Ingredients

- 1 box white cake mix
- 3 eggs
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- food coloring
- · candy eyeballs

Directions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 325 degrees F and line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 2. Whisk the eggs and vegetable oil together. If you're using any additional flavorings like vanilla extract (see other ideas in notes and above), add those in now.
- 3. Add the cake mix and whisk until fully combined.
- 4. Divide the batter into three bowls and add a few drops of food coloring to each. Stir to combine. Scoop 1-2 tbsp. sized cookie dough balls onto the baking sheet ensuring there is enough space between each cookie ball.
- 5. Bake for 10-12 minutes or until the edges are just starting to brown.
- 6. Press the candy eyeballs into the warm cookies and allow too cool.
