Management News

I hope that everybody is enjoying the autumn colors and the amazing fall weather that we've had. This is my favorite time of year and it's been great to see everyone out and about, enjoying themselves.

I would also like to remind everyone that "Basic" monthly carrying charges are increasing effective November 1, 2025. The new monthly carrying charges are as follows...

One Bedroom Unit - \$575.00 Two Bedroom Unit - \$640.00 Three Bedroom Unit - \$730.00

Please remember that carrying charge payments are due on the first of each month with a ten day grace period for payments that are made after the first of the month. You can bring your payment into the business office during regular business hours or you can simply leave the payment in a clearly marked envelope in the Carrying Charge Drop Box located at the front of the Raymond Community Building. Alternatively, you can also choose to make your payment electronically with our "PayLease" system. If you haven't used this payment method before, please stop into the Business Office during regular business hours so that we can explain how the system works and provide you with an informational flyer. Please note that any payments not received on or before the tenth (10th) of each month will result in a Late Fee being accessed to your account. The Late Fees at Hanover Grove are of an escalating nature... the first Late Fee is in the amount of \$25.00. The second Late Fee within a twelve month period is \$50.00. A third Late Fee within a twelve month period will result in a \$100.00 charge being added to your account and you will receive an invitation to join the Board of Directors at their next monthly meeting.

Lastly, I would like to take this opportunity to remind everyone to familiarize themselves with the rules and regulations regarding snow removal here at Hanover Grove. As we move into the cold weather months, it is imperative that members here at Hanover Grove fully understand the snow removal rules. Please make sure that all of your vehicles are registered with the front office. This will assist us in contacting you (prior to calling a tow truck) if your vehicle hasn't been moved in accordance with the rules. Additionally, please ensure that your vehicle is moved prior to the time listed in the Rules and Regulations for snow removal. Failure to move your vehicle in a timely manner may result in an Administrative Enforcement Fee being levied to your account.

That's all for this month. I hope that everyone has the chance to celebrate the Thanksgiving Holiday with friends and family!

SECTION 107 - VEHICLES, PARKING & DRIVING REGULATIONS

During the winter months, residents must move their vehicles as necessary for snow removal by the Maintenance Department. The following schedule has been determined for snow removal from parking areas. The drivers of the trucks plowing the snow will honk their horns to notify you that they are attempting to plow your parking area.

YOUR COOPERATION IS REQUIRED.

- Members living in **even** addresses (i.e., 31008, 15608, etc.) will have their parking areas plowed between 9:00 am and 12:00 NOON. All cars must be removed from the parking areas before 9:00 a.m.
- 107.11(b) Members living in **odd** addresses (i.e. 31125, 15819, etc.) will have their parking areas plowed between 1:00 pm and 5:00 pm. All cars must be removed from the parking areas before 1:00 p.m.
- The only exceptions to this rule will be those areas of Darby Lane and Van Avenue that have parking on one side of the street only and the Courts that comprise the 900 blocks of Darby, Sabre, and Van. These parking areas will be plowed in the afternoon, between 1:00 pm and 5:00 pm with the odd addresses.
- Residents not moving their cars during the appropriate time periods for snow removal may have their vehicles towed away at the owner's expense and receive a \$50.00 Administrative Enforcement Fee.
- Residents or their guests having inoperable vehicles in the parking areas during snow removal will also be subject to having their vehicles towed away at the owner's expense and receive a \$50.00 Administrative Enforcement fee.

ATTENTION RESIDENTS

If you do not have a Hanover Grove parking decal in your rear window and you have not complied with the above rules we will have no way to notify you and you will be towed away at your expense!



RECIPES

Kabocha Squash



Prep: 5 Minutes

Cook: 40 Minutes

Total: 45 Minutes



Prep: 10 Minutes Cook: 10 Minutes Total: 20 Minutes

Ingredients

- 1 medium (2 ½ lb.) kabocha squash
- 1 1/2 Tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil
- Kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 3 Tbsp. butter
- 1 Tbsp. low-sodium soy sauce
- 1 1/2 tsp. maple syrup

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 400° and line a baking sheet with aluminum foil. Halve squash and scoop out the pulp and seeds. (Seeds can be rinsed and reserved for another use, such as for roasting.) \

 2. Cut squash into 1 ½" half-moon slices and transfer to prepared baking sheet. Drizzle with oil and season to taste with salt and pepper. Toss to coat, and spread slices into one layer

coat, and spread slices into one layer.

3. Roast squash, flipping slices halfway through, until tender and beginning to brown, 30 to 35 minutes.

4. Meanwhile, in a small saucepan over medium-low heat, melt butter and

- 4. Meanwhile, in a small saucepan over medium-low heat, melt butter and cook until foam subsides. Continue to cook, stirring constantly, until milk solids have turned brown and butter smells like caramel, 2 to 3 minutes.
- 5. Immediately remove butter from heat and stir in soy sauce and maple syrup. Stir for about 20 seconds until thoroughly combined and slightly cooled.
- 6. Return sauce over medium heat, bring to a simmer, and cook for 1 to 2 minutes, or until just slightly thickened. Transfer squash to a platter. Drizzle with maple soy brown butter to serve.

Caramel Apple Oatmeal Cookies

Ingredients

- 1 cup butter, room temperature
- 1 3/4 cup light brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 2 teaspoons vanilla
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt

- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 3/4 cups flour
- 2 cups rolled oats
- 3/4 cup dried apple rings, diced
- 6 ounces soft caramel candies (like Kraft or Werther's)
- 1 teaspoon heavy cream

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper and set aside.
- 2. In the bowl of your stand mixer fitted with the paddle attachment, mix the butter and brown sugar together for 2 minutes on medium speed. Add in the eggs, vanilla, baking soda, salt, and cinnamon and continue mixing on medium for 1 minute, until combined, scraping the sides of the bowl as necessary.
- 3. Turn mixer to low and mix in the flour until just combined. Add in the oats and dried apples and mix until incorporated. Using a medium cookie scoop (2 tablespoons) drop the dough onto the prepared baking sheet, 3 inches apart. Bake for 8-10 minutes, or until the edges are lightly golden and the centers are just set.
- 4. Transfer cookies to a wire rack to cool. In a medium bowl combine the caramel candies and cream. Microwave in 15- second increments, stirring in between each, until the caramel is smooth.
- 5. Drizzle the caramel on top of the cookies.
