

I hope that everybody is enjoying the unseasonably warm temperatures and the fair weather that we've had. I've noticed that several members have taken this opportunity to decorate the front of their units for Halloween and I have to say that I am impressed... and a little frightened too! Please note that we are encouraging members to participate in the Trunk-or-Treat that we have scheduled for Saturday, October 25th at 1:00pm in Arbor Court. Additionally, I would like to remind everyone that "Basic" monthly carrying charges are increasing effective November 1, 2025. The new monthly carrying charges are as follows...

One Bedroom Unit - \$575.00

Two Bedroom Unit - \$640.00

Three Bedroom Unit - \$730.00


Please remember that carrying charge payments are due on the first of each month with a ten day grace period for payments that are made after the first of the month. You can bring your payment into the business office during regular business hours or you can simply leave the payment in a clearly marked envelope in the Carrying Charge Drop Box located at the front of the Raymond Community Building. Alternatively, you can also choose to make your payment electronically with our "PayLease" system. If you haven't used this payment method before, please stop into the Business Office during regular business hours so that we can explain how the system works and provide you with an informational flyer. Please note that any payments not received on or before the tenth (10th) of each month will result in a Late Fee being accessed to your account. The Late Fees at Hanover Grove are of an escalating nature... the first Late Fee is in the amount of \$25.00. The second Late Fee within a twelve month period is \$50.00. A third Late Fee within a twelve month period will result in a \$100.00 charge being added to your account and you will receive an invitation to join the Board of Directors at their next monthly meeting.

Lastly, I would like to share with everyone that we are scheduled to have Landscape Services perform their Annual Fall Clean-up this year. We don't have a firm date scheduled yet due to fluctuating outdoor temperatures and conditions. Once we have a date for the Clean-up, we'll make sure to send out a message to the community informing members of the schedule.

An Open Letter Regarding Marijuana Usage at Hanover Grove

Dear Members:

If you are not aware, Hanover Grove Cooperative was constructed pursuant to a housing program initiated by Congress. As a result, the Cooperative entered into agreements which required it to be governed by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). This agreement required the Cooperative to adhere to regulations of the Federal Government as it relates to housing.

One of the primary directives from HUD is that the <u>Cooperative must remain drug free, which</u> <u>includes all illegal drugs, including marijuana.</u> When the Cooperative adopted its Rules and Regulations and Occupancy Agreement it included prohibitions against such drug use.

Therefore, by the Cooperative documents and Federal Law, members of Hanover Grove Cooperative are forbidden from the use of any illicit drug as defined by Federal Law. Further, the Rules and Regulations and your Occupancy Agreement requires that the Cooperative provide each member peaceful enjoyment of their townhome.

Each member must refrain from actions which deny other members peaceable enjoyment of their townhome. Loud noises such as blaring TV's or sound systems, late night parties, and vacuuming after 10:00 p.m. are examples of denying your right to peaceable enjoyment. Smoking marijuana is another example because of the strong smell which permeates through the walls and subjects your neighbors and their children to this nuisance denying them peaceable enjoyment.

Recently, the State of Michigan enacted a series of new laws which modify the use and enable restrictions on the use of marijuana. A section of that law, MCL 333.26427(c)(3) states that the owner (Cooperative) can prevent the smoking or cultivation of marijuana. Therefore, despite the fact that you may have a medical marijuana card authorizing the use, you are prohibited from smoking marijuana at the Cooperative for the two reasons set forth; 1) restriction imposed by HUD regarding illicit drugs as defined by Federal Law, and 2) the State law prohibiting its use in a multi-family environment.

Although the Cooperative cannot endorse the use of medical marijuana due to Federal law, for those who have the medical need for its use, there are many other products available that will not adversely affect your neighbors.

This letter should serve as notice that the Cooperative will aggressively enforce the restriction of the use of illicit drugs, including smoking marijuana in any form. Such use may result in the possible loss of your membership and eviction.



RECIPES

Halloween Shepherds Pie



Prep: 10 Minutes

Cook: 30 Minutes

Total: 40 Minutes



Prep: 2 Minutes

Make: 10 Minutes

Total: 12 Minutes

Ingredients

- 2 pounds ground beef or lamb
- 1 yellow onion diced
- 12 ounce bag frozen mixed veggies
- 1 brown gravy mix
- 2 cups cheddar cheese
- 4 ounce package instant potatoes
 - 1-3 black olives

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F. Spray a baking dish with non stick spray and set aside.
- 2. In a large skillet over medium heat, brown ground beef and diced onion. Cook until meat is no longer pink and onions are translucent. Drain and add to baking dish in an even layer.
- 3. Microwave or boil frozen mixed veggies. Drain and add to casserole dish on top of meat mixture in an even layer.
- 1. Cook the brown gravy by following the directions on package. Pour the gravy evenly over the entire dish. Sprinkle shredded cheddar cheese on top. Bake for 20 minutes or until the cheese has melted.
- 5. While the shepherd's pie bakes, prepare the instant potatoes by following the directions on package.
- 6. Once cooked, place potatoes into a piping bag or freezer baggie with the corner snipped off. Pipe ghosts on top of the shepherd's pie.
- 7. Use a straw to punch out small black circles from black olives. Place them as "eyes" on the ghosts.
- 8. Enjoy!

No Bake Halloween Dessert Bars

Ingredients

- 1 package (9.75 to 10.5 ounces) Corn Chips
- 1 Cup Corn Syrup

- 1 Cup Sugar
 - 1 Cup Creamy Peanut Butter (be wild and use Crunchy!)

Directions

- 1. Spray a large baking pan with non-stick spray or line with parchment paper.
- 2. Spread the corn chips evenly across the surface of the prepared baking pan. There is no need to break them up.
- 3. In a large saucepan, add the Corn Syrup and Sugar and bring to a boil over medium to medium-high heat stirring constantly. Allow to boil for about 1 minute while continuing to stir constantly.
- 4. Remove from heat and stir in Peanut Butter until smooth. Remove the sweet mixture from the heat and stir in Peanut Butter until smooth. Now pour the mixture evenly over the top of the corn chips.
- 5. While the topping is still hot, add your candy condiments to the top. They will stick as the mixture dries. and cools. Allow cooling completely. Cut into bars and serve.
